Who can take part in the Waikato-Tainui: Ko Wai Taatou? rangatahi survey?

Tribal members of Waikato-Tainui descent, aged 18 - 24 yrs in September 2009. If you're registered with Waikato-Tainui, even better! You qualify for prize draws. What if I don't know much about my Marae or hapuu?

It doesn't matter. We need you to participate regardless of where you live, where you were raised, or how much you know about the tribe. Being Waikato-Tainui means something different to everyone and each tribal member can make a valuable contribution. Stand Up and Be Counted!

Why do we need a separate rangatahi survey?

Rangatahi are fundamental to enhancing the future wellbeing of our tribe. Men and women aged 18 - 24 yrs account for about a quarter of our registered members. So understanding your circumstances, needs and aspirations is critical for strategic planning and creating better opportunities. Now is when you make important decisions about education, training, work, career, culture, identity, whaanau and relationships. These decisions shape future pathways.

How can I take part in the rangatahi survey?

Can I only access the survey online?

What kinds of questions will I be asked?

Easy peasy ones like where do you live? do you work or study? what resources can you access? what are your future aspirations? and how do you see yourself as a Waikato-Tainui rangatahi? Your input will help build a statistical information base which will be used to improve tribal planning and development, and to provide better opportunities for you to prosper and flourish.

Will my privacy be protected?

Yes, absolutely! All data collected is completely confidential. Your name and other identifying information will not be stored with any of the responses you give. If you qualify for prizes, your name and contact details will be stored separately from your completed survey.
